California Inclusion and Behavior Consultation (CIBC) Network

is a statewide consultation service that responds to requests for technical assistance from administrators and teachers in early learning and care programs. Consultants respond to requests with onsite visits or phone consultations in order to support solutions to challenges when working with young children who have special needs or behavioral issues. Programs can request a meeting with a CIBC consultant for support and strategies to help create a high-quality inclusion experience.

The California Resource and Referral System.

The Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) agencies are located in every county in California. Local CCR&R agencies help families find child care that best meets their family needs, maintain comprehensive databases of licensed child care providers in their area, provide child care referrals to families for free upon request. CCR&R services are available to all parents and child care providers.

Strengthening Families Network (SFN)



is a community of practice made up of child care resource & referral CCR&R staff who are certified trainers by the National Alliance of Children's Trust and

Quality Counts California



is a collaboration between First 5 California and the California Department of Education, Early Learning and Care Division, and is implemented

at the county or regional level through locally tailored and operated Quality Rating and Improvement Systems (QRIS). Using a common set of early learning and care program standards and general guidance developed collaboratively through a state and local partnership, each QRIS assesses and rates voluntary participating programs in its own geographic area.
